### Arts & Crafts Revival

Credited with reviving many traditional crafts and lost methods of production, William Morris was a champion of the applied arts. Continuing his legacy, Morris & Co hosted an exclusive copper embossing workshop with silversmith Bryony Knox. Recently seen on BBC2's *Victorian House of Arts and Crafts*, she designs sculptures and silverware with a twist, using techniques such as repoussé and chasing, often with enamel or gilded details. In this intimate session, visitors were taught how to emboss with copper, producing their own Morris & Co inspired keepsake to take home.
